# Planning application for: 1860 BAYVIEW AVENUE File# 10 255840 NNY 25 OZ & 10 276757 NNY 25 SA

#### Site

The site is located at the northwest corner of Bayview and Broadway Avenues and was previously the site of an automobile dealership and service shops.

The site has a frontage along Broadway Avenue, and is bounded by Rappert Avenue on the west, Mount Hope Cemetery on the north, and Bayview Avenue on the east.

### **Proposal**

The applicant proposes to redevelop the property at 1860 Bayview Avenue with a 2 storey (16.45 metre) retail commercial building with 214 parking spaces of which 13 are at grade and the remainder within two levels of below grade parking. The proposal would have a total gross floor area of 7,090 m<sup>2</sup>, a lot coverage of 88% and a Floor Space Index (FSI) of 1.4.

Two-way access and egress for the parking and three loading spaces is proposed from both Bayview and Broadway Avenues.
